As we brought 2020 to a close, we all sighed a big sigh of relief. It was trying for everyone. Something many people did not realize was the effect these circumstances would have on child victims of abuse. Our final total of Forensic Interviews was 40 children fewer than 2019. While keeping in mind that our numbers went down, the severity of the cases we were seeing were much greater. For the first time in our history here at the CAC we recorded at least 2 physical abuse cases almost every month. This is not something we have seen since our opening. This year we had:

- 422 individuals served at the CAC
- 184 Children Served
- 108 Children under the age of 12
- 76 ages 13-17
- 159 Forensic Interviews
- 75 Sexual Abuse Outcries
- 1116 Units of Advocacy
- 1038 Therapy Sessions

So often we find ourselves focusing so heavily on the sexual abuse cases, but cases where children die from their abuse or suffer traumatic brain injuries remind us that we need to be more cognizant of other forms of abuse.

We are beyond grateful to our donors and our supporters. Without your help we could not have made it through 2020. While we are all still learning how to breathe through our masks during conversations, we constantly remain thankful for you!
